FOCCUS Facilitators Required Training in May

FOCCUS is a pre-marriage inventory for couples used in the Archdiocese of San Francisco. In 2014, the program was updated to a fully online system for scoring inventory results. Anyone using FOCCUS needs to be certified in the new system. Training is required for everyone working or wishing to work as a FOCCUS facilitator. Trainings are at the Pastoral Center, One Peter Yorke Way, San Francisco. Please note the date changes:

May 15 from 1:00 - 3:30 pm for those currently using FOCCUS who need to be “updated”;
May 17 from 1:00 - 4:30 pm for those who have never used FOCCUS;
May 18 from 1:00 - 5:00 pm for new users, in Spanish.

\$50 cost for materials May 15 or May 17; \$35 cost for May 18. There is no charge for the training itself. Pre-registration is required. To pre-register, or for questions, contact Ed Hopfner, above.
