Archbishop George H. Niederauer, the eighth archbishop of San Francisco, died on May 2, at the age of 80, and will be laid to rest this week.

Archbishop Emeritus Niederauer, a native of Los Angeles, California, was ordained to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Los Angeles in 1962. He held a doctorate in English Literature from the University of Southern California, and was a faculty member and rector at Saint John's Seminary College for nearly three decades. He served as bishop of the Diocese of Salt Lake City from 1995 to 2005 and archbishop of the Archdiocese of San Francisco from 2006 to 2012.

FOCCUS is a pre-marriage inventory for couples used in the Archdiocese of San Francisco. In 2014, the program was updated to a fully online system for scoring inventory results. Anyone using FOCCUS needs to be certified in the new system. Training is required for everyone working or wishing to work as a FOCCUS facilitator. Trainings are at the Pastoral Center, One Peter Yorke Way, San Francisco. Please note the date changes:

May 15 from 1:00 - 3:30 pm for those currently using FOCCUS who need to be "updated";

May 17 from 1:00 - 4:30 pm for those who have never used FOCCUS;

May 18 from 1:00 - 5:00 pm for new users, in Spanish.
